Annual Alumnae meet in collaboration with Spandana International Foundation, Guntur, 22nd November 2023

The program was started with a prayer dance by B.Ed., students. The chief guest and resource persons ignited the lamp and inaugurated the workshop Dr.C.Grace Indira madam introduced the guests and welcomed them on to the dais.



Dr.Sr.G.Theresamma, Correspondent of our college in her opening remarks mentioned the stages of development and she insisted that to guide the students teachers have to develop the skill of counseling.





Prof.T.Swarupa Rani, Principal briefly explained the purpose of the workshop. She also said that focus of the workshop is to understand the problem faced by the students and the strategies to be followed by the teachers to counsel them.



Later Dr.C.Grace Indira madam presented the minutes of Alumnae Association



Dr.Sr.Tresa KVM, Provincial Superior, Guntur Province in her keynote address said the burden of curriculum is giving more stress to the students and parents are not able to help them at home. So teacher's job has become more difficult we are all held up in emotional traffic jam. She also mentioned about psychologist 'Carl Rogers' who said counseling is all about relationships. The responsibility of the counselor is to recognize the emotion and accept and help them to overcome them. She appreciated for organizing workshop on counseling needs. She also suggested a workshop with some training sessions.

Mr. Samuel Jonathan, Commissioner RTI, Andhra Pradesh, mentioned the characters of Shakespeare drama. He said that equal importance must be given to both physical and mental development. Spending time with children makes them feel secure and comfortable.



Prof.Ch.Swaroop Rani, Dean, Principal, Department of Arts, Commerce & Law, Acharya Nagarjuna University, said that teaching profession is a great challenge. Teacher has to perform many more tasks other than teaching. The inaugural session come to end by vote of thanks proposed by Sr.Roselin A, Administrator SJCE, after tea break 1st session of the workshop was started.

In the 1st morning session Dr.Saroja madam told about behavior modification and humanistic psychology. She also said all learning theories will help us to modify the character. She also showed live example she made one of the participants to act as model for her demonstration and showed the method of tension relaxation. She also taught same techniques to get relief for certain health issues like Migraine, Fear of darkness etc.,



Hypnotherapy:

According to Keats truth is beauty and beauty is truth. We must do every work with concentration. A person with psychological happiness is great achiever. In hypnotherapy we will make the person go into deep sleep and we can rectify certain disorders like Fears, depression disorders attention deficit disorders, addiction etc. she also mentioned about exposure therapy, classical conditioning, flooding, social learning and cognitive behavior. She gave detailed information and techniques to overcome stress.

Mrs. Nagendra, M.E.O. Guntur, madam inspire of her busy schedule attended our program and appreciated our effort. She said teachers should concentrate more on building the personality of the student rather than his academic improvement.



Sri. Venkateswara Rao, Deputy D.E.O. Guntur, sir addressed the gathering and advised the teachers to use the counseling techniques in the schools where they work.



The 2nd session was taken by Dr. Vimala, madam told Guidance is for all, but counseling is for the best development of the students. She mentioned about career guidance and development of social skills and inter personal skills using power points. She also said about the modifications to be made by the person (student) to become desirable. She also insisted that formal guidance centre should be established in the school students should be given academic guidance and appreciation memory & techniques should be time management taught to them to improve in academics in adolescent age along with education student should be taught to behave well. Students grow by encouragement, love and appreciation. We learn things by observation. Teachers should involve the students in activities should ask the students to write the appropriate behavior in a piece of paper and check their personality. Academic guidance should be given teacher should teach them proper study habits should tell them to revise every 20 minutes while reading study habits, social skills, memory techniques time management help the students to excel in academics.

At 01:30 P.M. all the participants dispersed for lunch.



After the lunch break the afternoon session was started at 02:00 P.M.

Dr.Saroja madam told about Joe & Harry personality traits and open window with live example. She explained it clearly on the black board to make life better we must improve our strengths and also should overcome our weakness. Think positively give complements to others and receive complements. She made the participants to fill the cognitive restructuring worksheet and gave reality therapy. This Joe & Harry open window method helps to recognize the abilities of the student and to encourage him.



Afternoon 2nd session was started at 03:15 P.M. after tea break.

Dr.Vimala madam spoke about interpersonal counseling. She insisted on win-win model where the positive strength of the student is increased teacher should improve the qualities like forgiveness, gratitude, kindness and empathy. These qualities improve our self esteem and help us to sense the feelings of the child.

Goals are to be set for the students. Adult interaction is completely different from children. Student should be given homework on life events. Should work on specific areas of stress. Student should develop social support system and restore self esteem. The final words of this workshop are “Assist to live better”. Helping for individual maturity and promote happy and satisfying life.

Mr. Samuel Reddy Eda was the chief guest for the valedictory function. In his lecture he told some live examples and short video was played about his daughter’s suicide. He wanted to promote programmes which are useful to students on his daughter’s remembrance. He felt that teachers are the powerful weapons who can change the society. So he started a foundation on his daughters name and funding the educational institutions for some useful programmes.



Later the chief guest and the resource persons were honored by mementoes and shawls. Impressions were told by the participants. Most of them appreciated the conduct of workshop. The program came to an end by vote of thanks and National Anthem.
